
No matter wherever you are, whatever you do, whoever you are, together we can grow as Church Together.



Perhaps there are parallels we can draw from each of the above images. However, the pictures of Jesus in John's Gospel speak to us especially of LIFE (**John 6 v. 35; 10 v. 10; 15 v. 5**).

The light of the world promises that those who follow him, that is Jesus, will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life (John 1 v. 4; 8 v. 12), and in an age when we have light and warmth at the flick of a switch, it's hard to imagine just how significant the

link between light and life would have been for people years ago (and still is for millions in the world today!).

Consider, too, the imagery of new birth in **John 1 v. 12 - 13** (**ref: 3 v. 1 - 21**) and a baby's entry into the light from the darkness of the womb. The unborn child is familiar with the womb and lives in innocence. Yet at the same time the baby is entirely ignorant of the world around. To come into the light means leaving the 'comfort zone' and facing an unfamiliar world. Not to do so is tragic!

In our self – centred modern society it's tempting to ignore the needs of others and pursue lives of comfort. It's equally tempting for Christians to protect themselves from an unfriendly world and to cherish little havens of calm along with others who are 'in the light'. Ironically, to do so may actually mean we remain in darkness and ignorance. Christ's call to those born from above ('born again'), who live in his light, is to shine for him in the midst of everyday life (Matthew 5 v. 14 – 16).

Only when we obey do we really learn to depend on God and discover what it means to be fully alive in him.

An author once wrote of his experience on a

'quiet day'; he said:

'On a recent 'quiet day', I lit a candle in the room I was using and began to reflect on Jesus the light of the world, the fire of the Holy Spirit etc. A storm blew up outside the old building and the wind found numerous cracks through which to penetrate the stillness. The analogies I'd been working with now seemed inappropriate as the candle flame began to dance around wildly and threatened to go out altogether! Harried by the wind, the sensitive light appeared to be clinging on to the wick for dear life ... and suddenly I saw a different meaning. The light of my own life in Christ, vulnerable and easily swayed, depends for its existence on the source (John 1 v. 4). Taken away from the candle the flame would die, but holding on to the candle, indeed being a part of it, the fire could burn despite the storm that was raging outside. (John 1 v. 9; 15 v. 5). And I realised that in a strange way, when buffeted by the wind, the light had seemed more fully alive than it did when all was calm.'

The picture of 'Jesus being the light' reminds us of several things which we can find because of him. They are:

WE CAN FIND THE WAY BECAUSE OF HIM

How different is Christ, the light of the world, from the San Domingo lighthouse, constructed to commemorate the 500th anniversary of Columbus' arrival in the Americas! It was built on other people's suffering — 150,000 evicted from their shanty – town. The intensity of the lighthouse's 149 beams wipes out most of the city's power. The light that is Christ comes to us only through his own suffering; no one is plunged into darkness!

Just like a lighthouse exposes the hidden dangers of what is around them to those out at sea and therefore gives them a safe passage to land so it is that as the light of the world, Jesus, exposes what has been hidden and guides us through the path of life. To live in the light is to be honest and vulnerable with others and in fellowship with God (ref: 1 John 1 v. 5 - 7). As we express our needs and feelings, our sins and our struggles, with the people we trust, light will fall on our failures and strengths. This will give us the direction we need to make significant spiritual progress. (ref: John 1 v. 4 - 9; 3 v. 19 - 21; 12 v. 35, 46)

There are times when we need light to show us the way. As the Old Testament shows us, in the wilderness God provided a pillar of smoke and fire to guide his travelling people. Christ gives light to show us the way to the Father, and the way through life (John 1 v. 9).

WE CAN FIND JOY THROUGH KNOWING HIM

A fireworks party gives light, but also joy. Jesus and his friends went to the temple to celebrate the Feast of Tabernacles. One night of the festival commemorated the giving of light in the wilderness. The next day Jesus made a startling claim (John 8 v. 12). Is he our light to the extent that our worship is equally joy – filled?

The Feast of Tabernacles was celebrated in the temple's 'court of women' like this:

Three balconies were erected from which women and children could watch. Four golden seven-branched candlesticks were set on bases [23 metres] high. They terminated in huge cups into which oil was poured. Ladders were placed on each base, and priests mounted them and poured in enough oil to last until daybreak.

The light was of such intensity that all Jerusalem was lit up. As the light flared higher, men danced, waving torches, throwing them high in the air, and catching them again.

On the fifteen steps leading to the court of laymen stood Levites with lyres, cymbals, flutes and trumpets, singing the Hallel psalms.

It was said that 'he who has not seen the rejoicing at this ceremony has never seen rejoicing in his life.'

WE CAN FIND LIFE IN HIM


Without light, plant - life would disappear and thus all life would die out. This would be the destiny of humankind were it not for Jesus the eternal and invincible Light (John 1 v. 4, 5). The same God who created the universe (John 1 v. 3) is able to create new life in us. The light of life that exposes and drives away the darkness of the human race (John 1 v. 4 - 5) is the same light that brightens the dark corners of our world. This true Light of the World and source of all life is also the source of our spiritual renewal.

In conclusion, the words of Laurence Housman, in his writing The Little Plays of St Francis, maybe sums up all that we have said when he writes: 'Light looked down and beheld darkness; 'Thither will I go,' said Light. Peace looked down and beheld war; 'Thither will I go,' said Peace. Love looked down and beheld hatred; 'Thither will I go,' said Love. So came Light and shone; so came Peace and

gave rest; so came Love and brought life. And the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us
